The Particulars of its Organization functions and duties.

### **Brief History of the Institution -**

In response to the call given by the Father of the Nation in the year 1921, 4 students from the British Government run Grant Medical College, quit from their College to start a new nationalistic institution and that was the birth of Topiwalal National Medical College. At the beginning it was a Medical School and was registered for licentiate course by the College of Physicians and Surgeons. In the year 1946, the Silver Jubilee year of the Institutions, the college was taken over by the Mumbai Municipal Corporation and was affiliated to the University of Mumbai for the degree course. The College received a magnificent donation from the Topiwala Desai family and the well known Philanthropist Dr. Anandrao L. Nair and hence, it was named as Topiwala National Medical College and Bai Yamunabai L. Nair Charitable Hospital. Today, twin institutions are one of the leading institutions in the country.

This hospital is situated near Mumbai Central Station. Patients from all over India come to this hospital for treatment.

The Campus of this Institution consists of 28 numbers of building. The total bed strength of Hospital is 1623. Every year 55400(approx) patients are admitted and 280000(approx) patients (New & Old) are treated in out-patient Department at this hospital. 21000(approx) operations (Major & Minor) are performed and 4200 deliveries are done every year. This hospital levied fees from the patients at subsidies rate as per circular No. TRV/204 dated 09.05.2000 and TRV/141 dated 09.05.2001 and efforts are made to provide best & excellent patient care. In addition to the routine Medical Services, it also offers various super-speciality services in Nephrology, Neuro-surgery, Endocrinology, Gastro-enterology, Cardiology and Cardiac Vascular and Thoracic Surgery.

This Hospital has well equipped Intensive Care Units for Medical, Surgical, Cardiac and Neonate patients. For children, this hospital has an independent Intensive Care area, Trauma ward is situated next to Casualty.

This Hospital has its own Blood Bank and Component Therapy unit which provides services round the clock. It is recognized by the Food and Drug Administration. It is a Member of Federation of Blood Bank.

A whole body C.T. Scanner, Cardiac Catheterisation System and Spect Camera etc. are provided there. Spect Camera is a first of this kind to be installed in this hospital and offers a very wide range of diagnostic application in many fields of Medicine.

This Hospital has independent Hyperberic Oxygen Therapy Chambers housed in Kasturba Hospital permises. This is a second of its kind in the city of Brihanmumbai. The first being at Port Trust Hospital, Wadala.

Department of Urology of this hospital has Urodynamic equipments, the first of its kind in the Corporation Hospital, which helps in the diagnosis of Renal Diseases.

This Institution has many first to its credit, viz first open heart surgery was performed at Nair Hospital, first peritoneal dialysis was also done at Nair Hospital. This is the first hospital where PUVA therapy is provided by Skin Department.

#### TOPIWALA NATINAL MEDICAL COLLEGE -

This College was first started for Medical Licentiates during the National Movement in the year 1921 and was then called as National Medical College. In 1946, the College was upgraded to the degree courses and affiliated to the University of Mumbai in October 1946 and it was taken over by the Corporation and now it is one of the reputed Medical Colleges in Maharashtra State.

Every year 120 MBBS students are admitted the total under graduate students are 635, post-graduate degree students are 360, postgraduate diploma students are 51 and those doing M. Sc., Ph. D. The College is recognized by Medical Council of India for training in super-speciality subjects i.e. Cardiology, Cardiac Surgery, Neurology, Neurosurgery, Urology, Endocrinology, Gastro-enterology, Medicine, Plastic Surgery. It also conducts Audiology and Speech Therapy School which admits 10 students for the Degree Course of Audiology and Speech Therapy of Mumbai University. This facility is

only available at this institution.

The school of Occupational Therapy and Physiotherapy was started in the year 1990. Every year 10 students are admitted there at for training. At present there are 40 students each for Occupational Therapy and Physiotherapy.

This College has also to its credit a Nursing School which is recognized by the Nursing Council of India, admits 100 students every year.

At present this college is giving training to undergraduate and post graduate students as listed below.

### Library

### History -

The Department of Physiology was in existence from the inception of this college in 1921. In 1946 Dr. J.D. Pathak became the first full time Professor. After he left, Dr. T.H. Rindani became the Head of the Department. During his tenure the Department was shifted to the present college building. When Dr. Rindani was elevated to the post of Dean, in 1963, Dr. J.V. Bhatt took over as the Head. History repeated itself and Dr. J.V. Bhatt was appointed as Dean in 1979, when Dr. (Smt.) V.G. Parulkar became the Head. Dr. (Smt.) M.P. Sharma (nee Barua) took charge in 1994 when Dr. Parulkar retired. On her retirement in 2001 Dr. (Smt.) V.S. Dalvi took over as the head and continued till she opted for volnutary retirement in July 2007. Dr. (Smt.) R.B. Ichaporia succeeded her as the Head and she retired in October 2011. After her retirement Dr. Brinda Venkatraman took the charge as the Head of the department. In December 2014 she has been transfer to HHBT Medical College & Cooper Hospital, Andheri. Since then Dr. Pushpa Pazare is heading the department.

#### DEPARTMENT OF MICROBIOLOGY

### Point No. 2: PARTICULARS OF ORGANIZATION, FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES:

- Microbiology department existed as part of the Department of Pathology and Bacteriology since 1946. It became an independent Department in the year 1977 under the stewardship of Dr. (Smt.) Prema K. Murti from Feb 1977 to May 1991. During her tenure, post graduate seats for M.D. (Microbiology), M. Sc. (by research) and Ph. D. (Microbiology) were offered for the first time. The department was equipped with modular fluorescent phase contrast microscope, ELISA reader, ultra cold deep freezer and a computer. Photomicrography facility was made available to the entire institution.
- Dr V V Kale had a brief tenure as Professor & Head from June 1991 to May 1992.
- Dr. (Mrs.) G. V. Koppikar was Professor & Head of Microbiology from September 1992 to November 2004. Zonal AIDS Surveillance Center was established & the Lab was participating in High risk sentinel surveillance. Revised National Tuberculosis Control Programme (RNTCP). Commenced during this period.
- Dr. (Mrs.) K. Saraswathi was Professor & Head of Microbiology from December 2004 to September 2006. Additional area was made available in 2004 for Voluntary Confidential Counselling & Testing Center (VCCTC) activity. CD4/CD8 testing facilities are made available since March 2005.
- Dr Jayanthi S. Shastri is currently Professor & Head of the department since October 2006. She takes keen interest in Hospital Infection Control, Automation in Microbiology, activities of Integrated Counseling & Testing Center, External & Internal quality control. The Molecular diagnostic Lab. at Kasturba Infectious Disease Hospital was commissioned under her expert guidance and supervision in April 2007. This lab has been designated "regional HIV Reference Laboratory "by National AIDS Control Organization (NACO) in 2010. The lab extends HIV Viral load testing to patients before starting 2<sup>nd</sup> line ART & HIV DNA PCR as part of "Early infant Diagnosis". During her tenure, NABL Accreditation of HIV Labs, Setting up of Immunology & Gene Expert Labs were achieved. Department of Microbiology has been designated Regional Reproductive Tract Infections/Sexually Transmitted Infections

(RTI/STI)Testing, Training, Research & Reference (RSTRRL) by National AIDS Control Organization in February 2015. Through this lab etiological diagnosis of RTI/STI in high risk & low risk patients is made possible.

#### TIMINGS OF THE DEPARTMENT:

- a **Department timings:** 9 am to 4.30 pm
- b Emergency laboratory: 4.30 pm to 8 am

#### SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE DEPARTMENT:

All clinical samples (OPD & Inpatients) are accepted on all working days from 9 am to 12.00 noon. Emergency samples are accepted from 4 pm onwards in the Emergency Laboratory situated in G Building, 1st Floor.

Processing of samples, identification of the clinical isolates and Antibiotic Sensitivity Test (AST) is done as per the standard protocols and reports are dispatched to the respective Wards/Units on daily basis. On an average 2,27,000 samples are being processed annually towards patient care. All these investigations are done free of cost for MCGM patients admitted to our hospital.

OT Surveillance, Sterility checking and testing of disinfectants are done as a part of Hospital infection control surveillance.

#### **SPECIAL FACILITIES PROVIDED:**

- 1) Integrated Counselling & Testing Center (ICTC) for Counselling & HIV testing is made available through Mumbai District AIDS control society.
- 2) CD4 facilities are made available free of cost for patients on ART.
- 3) RNTCP: Sputum samples for detection of pulmonary tuberculosis and Extra Pulmonary samples are processed.
- 4) Gene Expert facility offers rapid & Molecular Diagnosis of Tuberculosis.
- 5) Reproductive tract / Sexually Transmitted Infections diagnosis.
- 6) Food handlers from various eating houses in Mumbai are screened regularly for communicable diseases required for certification.
- 7) Surveillance of Nosocomial outbreaks.
- 8) Fever Profile
- 9) Hepatitis Viral Markers
- 10) Our department plays key role in formulating guidelines for Hospital Infection Control / Solid Waste Management and implementation of the same.

#### **TEACHING ACTIVITIES:**

### **Undergraduate teaching:**

1) Lectures are held for undergraduate (M.B.B.S., B.D.S., O.T., P.T.) students. Practical tutorials are held for undergraduate (M.B.B.S., B.D.S.) & D.M.L.T.,BPMT students. Classes for Nursing students are also carried out by the departmental teaching staff. Over 550 students at any given time, from various faculties get the benefit of regular teaching in the department of microbiology.

### **Post Graduate Teaching:**

1) Post-graduate seminars/Journal Review are held twice every week. Post graduates participate in Seminars, Symposium and Inter-college meetings. All the teaching

faculty

takes active part in these presentations & guide the post graduate students. Microbiology Department is recognized for M.D. Microbiology under MUHS, Nashik while M.Sc. Microbiology by research and Ph.D. Microbiology degrees by Mumbai University.

### Point No.3: POWERS & DUTIES OF OFFICERS & EMPLOYEES:

Professors, Associate Professors & Assistant Professors are involved in conducting lectures for various disciplines. Assistant Professors and resident (post graduate) doctors take tutorials/practicals for various disciplines.

One Professor & Assistant Professor are asked to look after laboratories in Kasturba Hospital along with their other teaching related activities. Head of Microbiology Department also visits & supervises PCR laboratory work every day.

Technicians, assistants & attendants look after actual laboratory test work while Junior Scientific Officers look after proper technical perfection of all the procedures & also look after reagent, media & supply of other accessories for the smooth functioning of the laboratories. Servants & sweepers look after maintaining cleanliness & washing related works in respective sections. Clerk cum typist, clerk etc help in typing, dispatch & record keeping work as well as stores related duties. Counselors perform pre- and post-test counseling of all those who come for HIV testing in our department.

#### **Point No.9: PROCEDURE FOLLOWED IN DECISION MAKING PROCESS:**

Decision in usage of proper diagnostic kits to be used for diagnosis of monsoon related illnesses is done depending upon the prevalent strains and the stage of illness e.g. Antigen detection kits used for early diagnosis (first 3 to5 days), while Antibody based tests used for diagnosis of illnesses after 7 days of illness (IgM or IgG based tests). HIC of Microbiology department has been involved in formulation of Antibiotic policy for MCGM hospitals.

#### **Point No.15: NORMS SET BY IT FOR DISCHARGE OF ITS FUNCTIONS:**

Each of the sub sections of Microbiology Department is supervised by either a Professor, Associate professor or an Assistant Professor. Head of The Department maintains overall control on management of all the activities.

### **Pharmacology Department**

### \* Particulars of Organization, Functions and Duties

Pharmacology Department is located on 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the college building and does the following functions – teaching pharmacology subject for various undergraduate and postgraduate courses, carries out clinical and animal research projects. Nuclear Medicine Unit of the institute is under the administrative control of Pharmacology Department and gives following patient services.

Radioisotope scans of thyroid, bone, kidneys etc are done and radioactive iodine therapy is given whenever necessary.

At present teaching staff consists of 1 Professor and Head, 2 Additional Professors, 2 Associate Professors and 2 Assistant Professors.

Non-teaching staff consists of part time clerk cum typist, Record Assistant, Laboratory technicians, Laboratory attendants, servants for pharmacology department and Nuclear medicine unit is headed by one Additional Professor and has Sr. Scientific Officer, Jr. Scientific Officer, Laboratory technician, Laboratory attendant and Servants.

Head of the Department assigns various duties to the staff to carry out teaching research, patient services and administration.

In addition various staff members are also working on various committees of the institute like ethics committee, website committee, medical education teaching technology, research society, student gymkhana etc.

### \* Decision making process -

To carry out the above mentioned duties regular meetings are conducted of the staff members and time table for teaching duties are prepared regularly. Research projects are carried out depending upon the feasibility and availability of facilities.

### \* Norms set by it for discharge of its functions -

Head of the Department is overall in charge of functions of the Pharmacology Department and DR. Bhairavi Bhatt is in charge of Nuclear Medicine Unit. To carry out teaching duties various teachers are made in charge for different courses e.g. MD, MBBS, BDS, BOTH, BPTH, Nursing etc. Teaching is carried out as per the curriculum laid down by the University.

#### DEPARTMENT OF FORENSIC MEDICINE

T.N. MEDICAL COLLEGE & B.Y.L. NAIR CHARITABLE HOSPITAL

The Department of Forensic Medicine, TNMC & BYL Nair Ch. Hospital, discharges two primary duties – curricular and Medicolegal.

### 1) CURRICULAR DUTIES

#### • UNDERGRADUATE MEDICAL EDUCATION

Forensic Medicine is a compulsory subject in the Second MBBS course, and is taught over duration of three semesters.

#### POST GRADUATE MEDICAL EDUCATION

The department has been recognized by Medical Council of India for the degree (MD) & diploma (DFM) course.

### 2) MEDICOLEGAL DUTIES

c This department conducts medico legal autopsies on the bodies of persons who die sudden unexpected, unexplained deaths, unnatural deaths, or death occurring under circumstances suggestive of foul play, either in our hospital within the jurisdiction of police stations, Agripada, Tardeo, N.M. Joshi Marg, Worli and Mumbai Central Terminus (Railway), between the hours of 09.00 am and 08.00 pm each day.

- d The department also conducts examination of antemortem cases (age estimation, sexual assault, injury, etc.), referred by different courts, police stations, NGO's in Mumbai.
- e Staff members of this department visit the scenes where bodies referred for medicolegal autopsy have been discovered, whenever such a visit would help to elucidate the circumstances under which such victims may have died and as to how the autopsy should be conducted.
- f Staff members of this department who have conducted medicolegal autopsies on the victims of homicide and transportation accident have also to depose in criminal courts and Motor vehicular Accident Tribunals as expert witnesses.

#### **OTHER DUTIES**

The department is NODAL DEPARTMENT of MCPC. It works in association with the Department of Preventive & Social Medicine, Pediatrics, Psychiatry & Obstetrics & Gynaecology, of the Multidisciplinary Child Protection Cell & Sexual Offences Response Team of our institution.

### **Department of General Surgery**

#### **Introduction:**

The Department of General Surgery or the The Department of General Surgery, GESS and HBOT as it is formally referred to, has a broad scope in the surgical management of patients.

The functions of the department could be broadly divided into the following categories:

#### Patient care:

- 11) Care of patients in the outpatient departments.
- 12) Care of Surgical Emergency Patients
- 13) Care of Trauma and Accident victims
- 14) Disaster Management
- 15) Performance of surgical Operations in the Elective and Emergency

Settings.

#### **Education:**

- 2) Training of Students through Lectures, Demonstrations and Tutorials
- 3) Training in the wards, through surgical Clinics and ward rounds
- 4) Training in the outpatient department
- 5) Student training in the operating theater.
- 6) Conducting academic assessment of students at various times with ward examinations etc.

The Department is headed by Professor Dr. M.K. Sanjana. For the efficacious discharge of its functions the Department of Surgery is divided into six Surgical 'Units'. The typical Surgical Unit consists of The Professor and Head of Unit, an Associate Professor, Assistant Professor, SMO(Specialty Medical Officer), Surgery residents in their 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year of Surgical Residency, Interns and medical students, who may be allocated to a unit from time to time. Each Surgical Unit is allocated a day of the week for conducting their outpatient services. All surgical patients presenting in the emergency on that day of the week, as also indoor patients belonging to other specialties who might require surgical care are attended to by that particular unit.

This form of organization is the norm in our country and also all over the world with few minor changes.

Patients are attended to first, in the main, by surgery residents. There is a well established protocol of communication, checks and balances in the hierarchial organization of the department. In any given patient situation, this enables smooth and uninterrupted passage of information and decision-making within the unit and the department as a whole.

### **Endocrine Surgery:**

Surgical treatment for diseases of the endocrine system has evolved into a sub-specialty in itself. The Surgical Unit headed by Dr. M.K. Sanjana addresses this need of patients, in consort with the department of endocrinology.

### **Breast Surgery:**

The surgical service for diseases of the breast is headed by Dr. Jayashri S. Pandya, with an outpatient department dedicated to breast disease. The Breast O.P.D. is conducted every Wednesday, between 1:00 PM and 4:00 PM

The breast service holds regular 'camps' at various locations with a view to increasing awareness about breast diseases, counselling and early diagnosis of those diseases that require early intervention.

#### **Podiatrics:**

With the high prevalence of diabetes in Mumbai, there is the inevitable increase in the number of patients suffering from surgical complications of the foot, commonly known as 'diabetic foot'. In order to address this need in our society, the department of General Surgery has a Podiatric service, headed by Dr. T.S. Shetty. This service works in close association with the department of endocrinology, for the comprehensive care of patients with foot complications as a result of diabetes.

#### **GESS:**

Advanced Care of diseases of the GI tract involves a high level of skill and specialization. The surgical unit headed by Dr. Rajeev M Joshi serves the need for a committed GI surgery services, specially in the areas of Hepatobiliary and pancreatic Surgery.

#### **Surgical Endoscopy:**

Our ability to access the gastrointestinal tract by the insertion of flexible endoscopes through natural orifices gives us the ability to diagnose and treat a multitude of diseases without wielding the knife.

Both upper and Lower GI endoscopic services are offered by the Department. Training of senior residents and faculty in GI endoscopy is also carried out.

### Laparoscopy:

The laparoscope is a more recent technological advancement which gives us the ability to access the entire abdominal cavity as also the chest, to carry out even the most complex procedures which would otherwise require large incisions, through what is popularly known as 'Minimal Access Surgery' or 'Key Hole Surgery'. The Department of Surgery is able to offer the entire gamut of procedures that can be carried out through laparoscopy, to its patients.

### **Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy Unit:**

The Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy unit run by the Department of Surgery is situated in the premises of the Kasturba Hospital. It is the oldest functioning unit for this mode of therapy in the city of Mumbai. Over the last three decades, this unit has provided HBOT to patients, not just from Nair Hospital, but all other municipal and government hospitals in the city, and any patient requiring HBOT from the private hospitals and nursing homes as well.

Running such a large organization smoothly requires an administrative machinery in place, so that situations and issues are tackled as soon as they present themselves. For administrative purposes, the department has formed subcommittees as under:

#### **Radiation Oncology Center:**

Radiation Oncology Center has been in existence since 21st March 1998. It also caters to patients who require Palliative therapy as well as supportive therapy. It is one of the department that can boast of multidisciplinary approach to cancer. There is constant up-gradation of the department with plans of further growth of the services which are Teletherapy, Brachytherapy and Palliative Medicine.

#### **Brachytherapy**:

Brachytherapy is one of the essential radiotherapy options for treatment of Cancer as in gynecological malignancies, head-neck cancers and gastrointestinal cancers. Brachytherapy is most essential for gynaecological malignancies i.e. cancer cervix. It is a part of therapy essential in both treatment and cancer cervix per primum as well as in post-op cancer cervix. Brachytherapy is used to augment internal radiotherapy doses.

Department is run in two shifts Since December 2013

Morning shift from 9 am to 4 pm Afternoon shift from 2 pm to 9 pm

In OPD, New patients are registered and patients are called for follow up.

### **Department of Ophthalmology**

T.N. Medical College & B.Y.L. Nair Charitable Hospital

#### History

• The ophthalmology department was established in 1923 with Dr. C.R. Athavale in-charge of the department. He was succeeded by Dr. Hiralal Patel who was Honorary Professor & HOD (1945-1957). In 1945, an important landmark, a full-fledged ophthalmic unit was established and 16 beds were exclusively reserved for ophthalmic patients.

Dr.A.M.Gokhale then took over as Honorary Professor and Head of the department (1957-1971). Dr.Gokhale was a stern disciplinarian and expanded the ophthalmology department considerably. He did the first keratoplasty in Mumbai in 1951 and specialized in ERG. He continued his association with these institutions even after retirement.

Dr. Abreu was Honorary Ophthalmologist from 1969 to 1970 & was the first to head the second unit which started in 1969. In the same year i.e. in 1969 with Maharashtra Government approval, Eye bank was started under Cornea Grafting Act, 1969.

Dr.Piyush Dixit succeeded Dr. Gokhale as Honorary Professor and Head (1971-1985). Mobile Ophthalmic Van, the only van of its kind in Mumbai was made available for community ophthalmic services in 1975.

Dr.(Smt) Gynam Murthy then took over the department as Professor and Head in 1985 & continued till 2004. She played an important role for having an in-house Ophthalmology OT at B.Y.L. Nair Hospital.

Mobile Ophthalmic Van was replaced with a new well equipped van in June 2004 with the donation from Lion's club of Byculla.

Later, Dr. H.L. Trivedi, Associate Professor was Ag. HOD from Aug.2004 till Sept.2005.

Dr. A.D. Nicholson then joined as Professor & Head from Sept. 2005 till August 2016. During her tenure major donation through LCIF was procured for upgradation of the department.

Currently Dr Saroj I. Sahdev, vitreo retinal specialist & Professor is heading the department from September 2016 till date. She is also a coordinator for International Council Of Ophthalmology exams.

Critical patients requiring cardiac and ventilatory support and other organ supports are managed in these 2 areas round the clock, 365 days of the year. In addition, patients recovering from anaesthesia are routinely managed in the recovery rooms attached to Ortho OT, Gyn-Obstetric OT and in Recovery Room at Dental Hospital. Acute Pain relief services are an essential part of our management in the above areas.

- **D) Pain Clinic Services:-** Patients suffering from chronic pain due to various causes are treated in pain clinic with various nerve blocks, pharmacotherapy and multimodal treatment.
  - Anaesthesia Laboratory Services: Blood Gas analysis, Serum Electrolyte and Pulmonary Function Tests using portable machine & blood sugar estimations are performed in Anaesthesia Laboratory attached to Main O.T. Complex. 6724 ABG / Electrolytes & 524 PFT investigations were done in the last year.

#### Anaesthesia Services offered include

- c) Regional Nerve Blocks
- d) Local Anaesthesia with or without conscious sedation and Monitored Anaesthesia Care(MAC).

## **Department of Community Medicine**

# History

The Department of Community Medicine, which was started in 1956, has expanded over the years. To begin with, a comprehensive medical care service was started for the residents of Sweeper colony at Arthur road. From 1959 to 1965 Dr. V.N. Phanse headed the department. From 1966, Dr. (Smt.) Saroj Jha took over as Professor & Head. Around 1977, the University of Bombay revised the Preventive & Social Medicine curriculum by introducing a full theory paper with practicals. Topiwala National Medical College received 3 mobile health clinic vehicles in 1978 under the centrally sponsored Reorientation of Medical Education (ROME) Scheme. The slum adopted for this purpose was Ramtek near Malad. Around 1980-81, a full-fledged Urban Health Centre at Shivaji Nagar was started. Cheetah Camp Urban Health Centre was started in 1983.

Dr. (Smt.) Nalini P. Pai took over as departmental Head in 1983 till 1998. Dr. E.E. Daniel took over as the departmental Head from 1998 to 2001. Dr. R.Y. Aras was Professor and Head from 2001 to 2009, then Dr. S R Suryawanshi became professor and Head from 1st July'2009.

Cardiology department is busy department catering to all types of cardiac diseases. The department has a well equipped intensive cardiac care unit along with state of the art cardiac catheterization laboratory with regular out-patient department serving the newly registered patients and those who report for periodic follow up.

Diagnostic and therapeutic procedures like coronary angiography, coronary angioplasty and stenting, valvuloplasties of all types (aortic, mitral, pulmonary, tricuspid), pacemaker implantation including their advanced types (AICD, CRT, CRT-D), Device closures for Atrial septal defect, ventricular septal, defects, persistent ductux arteriosus device closure, coarctoplasty with stenting, device closure of Ruptured sinus of valsava (RSOV), Peripheral balloon angioplasty with stenting including renal artery angioplasty with stenting, retrieval of stucked consumables during procedure like catheterization and dialysis, Vena cava filter deployment.

The department is actively serving the poor patients for 24×7 hours and is readily available for any cardiovascular emergency.

The department is equipped with latest technologies like rotational atherectomy for the treatment of calcific and undilatable blocks. OCT (Optical coherence tomography) is available for assessment of borderline lesions and successful deployment

and apposition of stents enhancing further event free acute and long term outcome following coronary angioplasty and stenting. IABP (Intra arterial balloon pump) is available for the cardiogenic shock patients and for high risk interventions.

Educational activities – Regualr academic activities including case presentations, Journal club and seminars, intersting cases (ECG and cath discussions) are held every week.

3 DM and 3 BPMT students are admitted every year. Lectures and practical teaching is also provided to various under graduates and post graduates.

Since its inception, the department has rendered excellent clinical care, endoscopic work and contributed important research data in the Indian context. Following Dr. Antia retirement as Professor & Head in 1974, professor H.G. Desai, Professor R.H. Karlo and Professor Dr. Shobna Bhatia were the Heads of the Department successfully till 13<sup>th</sup> March 2006. Dr. Pravin M. Rathi took over the department on 14<sup>th</sup> march 2006 and is presently in-charge of the department.

### ENDOCRINOLOGY CLINIC AND GROWTH CLINIC-

In the Endocrine OPD, patients with Growth & Pubertal Disorders, Hypothalamopituitary disorders, adrenal diseases, Reproductive disorders including PCOS & hirsuitism, Parathyroid disorders, Metabolic Bone Diseases and Genetic/chromosomal disorders are evaluated.

#### **DIABETES CLINIC-**

The Diabetes Clinic runs OPDs for new patients on Mondays and Thursdays from 9.00 a.m. onwards. Patients are examined in detail. A complete dietary assessment is made and caloric adjustment is made according to the patient's dietary habits. A full social work up is also carried out. Patients spend about an hour and a half for these evaluations and then therapy is decided.

Follow-up patients are seen every Monday and Thursday from 1.30.p.m. onwards. Blood Sugars are repeated every three monthly and dosages of drugs are adjusted according to these reports in well compliant, well adjusted patients. Less compliant or less well adjusted patients are evaluated at lesser intervals. Patients are also evaluated for any specific problem that they may have and are treated accordingly.

Special care is taken of patients with juvenile diabetes (Type 1 Diabetes) and of pregnant diabetic women. All services are offered as and when needed to the patients with complications e.g. laser therapy with retinopathy and dialysis for nephropathy. Besides 3 monthly blood sugars lipidograms, glycated haemoglobin, renal and liver function tests are carried out initially. These and any other investigations are carried out for patients with diabetes when indicated.

We have recently started a Podiatry Service wherein patients are evaluated for Neuropathy using a Biosthesiometer and Vascular insufficiency using a portable doppler. Preventive measures are recommended for patients with a high risk foot – in terms of off loading, specialized foot wear etc.

#### THYROID CLINIC-

This is completely geared for the diagnosis and management of all thyroid disorders like goiters, nodules, multinodular goiters, hypothyroidism, thyrotoxicosis or malignancy. Besides the staff of the Endocrine Department- the Radioisotope unit and a Surgeon who has specialized in thyroid surgery attend the Thyroid Clinic. The Pathology Department by virtue of FNAC and Histopathology of Surgical Specimens also contributes to the work up of patients with thyroid disorders. Radio Isotope scanning for the thyroid gland, Radio- Iodine Therapy for patients with thyrotoxicosis can be administered in the Radio Isotope Department.

# **Department of Haematology**

T.N. Medical College & B.Y.L. Nair Ch. Hospital

Department of Haematology has Clinical Haematology and Haematology laboratory.

## Clinical Haematology -

In-charge - Dr. Vrinda K. Kulkarni

#### OPD -

Haematology OPD is held twice a week i.e. on Monday and Thursday from 8.30 a.m. onwards.

We have about 400 patients attending OPD. Every OPD day 6-7 new patients are enrolled & approximately 40 old patients come fro follow up. The senior staff gives adequate training to the resident medical doctors (two seniors and one/two juniors) regarding OPD treatment as well as emergency management of Haematology and Oncology cases. Patients come in the morning for blood collection as per the prior appointment and they are attended by the doctors with the blood reports in the OPD. Each patient is given 'H' number and a proforma is filled at the 1<sup>st</sup> visit. Thus clinical Haematology works in collaboration with lab Haematology. Subsequently proforma is updated on follow up of the patients.

#### Indoor -

Our specialty has 25 beds for indoor service. Patients requiring emergency management as well as chemotherapy get admitted in ward.

# Haematology laboratory -

Specialized investigations pertaining to Haematology are carried out in this lab. This lab also caters to research projects of the dept. of Medicine & other departments from the institution. Transfusion services are provided for pediatric as well as adult Thalassemia patients.

Blood transfusion is given to 6-8 Thalassemia patients per day on the non-OPD days as per prior appointment. Till date we have approx 75 Thalassemia patients availing of the blood transfusion services.

# **Major Investigation -**

Complete Heamogram, blood Reticulocytes, ESR, Serum Iron, Total Iron Binding capacity, Hb testing on HPLC, Sickling test, Bone marrow aspiration & Transferin Saturation.

## **Educational activities -**

Haematology residents as well as residents doing M.D. (Medicine), M.D. (Pthology) are taught during the OPD as well as on ward rounds. Regular academic

activities include Case presentation, Drug review, Journal club, Power point presentation.

# **Departmental Library -**

Haematology Department have 92 Educational books.

#### **Future Plans -**

- \* Department will continue 4<sup>th</sup> year of "Fellowship in Haematology" by MUHS, Nashik for the students who have completed post-graduation in Medicine/Pathology.

This activity will emphasize on public awareness about these conditions and will help prevent morbidity and mortality.

# **Department of Clinical Pharmacology**

# Patient Care Services of the Department of Clinical Pharmacology

- I] Therapeutic Drug Monitoring (TDM) services TDM OPD is run every Friday morning wherein levels of various anti-epileptic drugs (*viz.* phenytoin, carbamazepine, sodium valproate, phenobarbitone, oxcarbazepine, lamotrigine and levetiracetam) and risperidone & lithium levels are estimated using High Performance Liquid Chromatography out in patients suffering from epilepsy and psychiatry disorders. Patients are also counseled regarding their drugs schedule, drug interactions, possible adverse reactions and precautions to be taken. The Department also processes and analyses drug levels of patients admitted at Nair hospital and other municipal hospitals like LTMGH, KEM & Cooper Hospitals. Every year more than 1000 epileptic and 100 psychiatry patients avail this facility.
- II] **Pharmacovigilance activity** for the Adverse Drug Reaction (ADR) monitoring of allopathic drugs. Adverse Drug Reactions reported from the various departments of the Institute and from private practitioners are documented at the Centre and causality analysis of the reports is carried out. Drug information on various aspects of drug use is

also provided by the Department. The Department is one of the ADR Monitoring Centres under the Pharmacovigilance Program of India (PvPI) under the Government of India. Adverse Drug Reactions reported from the various departments of the Institute are documented at the AMC and entered in the WHO Vigiflow system. Causality analysis of the reports is also performed.

II] Ayurvedic Services: the services mentioned below are offered by the "Dr. Sharadini Dahanukar - Advanced Centre for Ayurvedic Research Training & Services" (SD-ACARTS) under the Department

The Department also runs an Ayurvedic OPD twice a week on every Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons between 1.30 to 3.30 PM. These services are offered by the "Dr. Sharadini Dahanukar - Advanced Centre for Ayurvedic Research Training & Services" (SD-ACARTS) under the Department of Clinical Pharmacology. The Ayurvedic OPD serves upward of 2000 patients annually. Ayurvedic medicines are given free of charge here.

The Department is a recognized Pharmacovigilance Centre for the Adverse Drug Reaction Monitoring activity for Ayurveda, Siddha & Unani drugs. Adverse Drug Reactions reported from the various departments of the Institute and from private practitioners are documented at the Centre and causality analysis of the reports is carried out. Drug information on various aspects of drug use is also provided by the Department.

Panchakarma (Ayurvedic therapeutic procedures) unit wherein various therapies are offered on an outpatient basis at a minimal cost. This Centre has been established with support from the Department of AYUSH, Govt. of India The Ayurvedic Panchkarma Therapy Unit supported by the Govt. of India grant, provides facilities for the various therapeutic procedures described in Ayurveda. About 100 patients are treated annually.

Additionally, herbal medicines are tested for heavy metal and steroid adulteration.

III] Genotyping services: Our department has a well-equipped Molecular Diagnostic laboratory wherein where-in genotyping of patient samples are carried out to correlate genetic variations with clinical non-response to drugs. Several genes viz. CYP2C9\*2/\*3, RFC, UGTA1\*20, VKORC1, TPMT, MTHFR 677 & 1298, ApoA, CETP, LDLR, CYP3A4\*1B, ApoB & HLA A\*3101, HLA B\*1502 have been standardized as a part of patient care activities which are beneficial to the hospital clinicians in managing the clinical strategy of the patients who are genetic variants. About 330 patients have availed of these services for better clinical management of their condition with a reporting of more than 860 alleles. Special Features/ Special Services/ instruments of the Department.

# **Department of Pediatric Surgery**

The department of Paediatric Surgery manages congenital anomalies including neonatal surgeries, paediatric gastrointestinal surgeries, paediatric urology, paediatric minimal access surgery and antenatal counseling for congenital anomalies.

The department conducts regular academic activities for post-graduate students in the form of clinics, seminars and presentations. The department has over 50 publications in various national and international journals in the last three years. The faculty and residents attend various national conferences, academic meets and workshops. The students of the department have been meritorious in the University Examinations in the last three years.

# History-

The Neurosurgery department of T.N. Medical college & B.Y.L. Nair Charitable Hospital was established in September 1971 when late Dr. Vijay G. Daftary, who was then heading one of the general surgery units, was made Head of Neurosurgery Department. He continued till his retirement in 1978. Dr. U.S. Vengsarkar took over & he retired in September 1992. Dr. H.V. Savant became Head of department from October 1992 till April 2016. Dr. T.D.Nadkarni is the present Head of the Department from May 2016.

Stereotactic Neurosurgery for Parkinson's disease, was done first time in western India at B.Y.L. Nair Hospital, in 1980.

## **Services Offered**

We offer treatment in all the subspecialties of Neurosurgical field. We have two new state of the art Operation Theatres (OT) well equipped for various Neurosurgeries. There is a dedicated OT for conducting Stereotactic Neurosurgery. The following surgeries are conducted on a regular basis.

We are operating 450-500 cases every year which include open heart surgery (MVR, AVR, DVR, CABG, VSD, TOF) Peripheral vascular (Bypass grafting-Femorofemoral, femoro popliteal, embolectomy) and lung surgery.

We are also doing minimally invasive aortic and mitral valve surgery, arterial grafting, and VATS cases.

We have 3 OPD days where we are attending close to 40-50 patients who are on follow up. We have 3 wards where on an average 30-35 patients are indoor.

We have 2 research articles which were published last year in the international journal of medical research and review.

- 1) Role of thymectomy in myasthenia gravis
- 2) Role of minimally invasive surgery in cardiac valve disease.

We had also published as case report in Indian journal of thoracic and cardiovascular surgery Emergency grafting in a case of portal vein injury.

The department of urology has full fledged Endourology, ESWL, Laparascopy, Open surgery and Urodynamic Units. Endourology procedures for treatment of stone diseases & prostatic diseases help in reducing the hospital stay and cost of treatment. The hospital has state of art ESWL (Extracorporeal shock wave lithotirpsy) machine helps to remove renal stones without surgery on opd basis. We regularly do laparascopic

surgery for various urological procedure such as phyeoplasty Adrenalectomy and redical nephrectomy. We have a working Urodynamic lab in our dept. this facility helps in diagnosis management of complex voiding disorder and urinary incontinence as seen after cord injuries or in birth defects.

The Physiotherapy Department was established in a small room in the old building with Shri M.L. Chainani, a graduate of the first batch of physiotherapy in India in 1956. The department has developed over years from it's budding stage, to a full-fledged teaching and rehabilitation centre. The two-year Master in Physiotherapy program under Mumbai University was started in 1981. The 3 ½ years Bachelor in Physiotherapy program under Mumbai University was started in 1990. In 2003, the 2 year Masters program was upgraded to 3 years. The undergraduate and post graduate courses were transferred to MUHS in 1998 and 2006 respectively. Under MUHS, the undergraduate course became the 4 ½ year Bachelor in Physiotherapy (B.P.Th) and the post graduate course became the 3 year Masters in Physiotherapy (M.P.Th).

Physiotherapy plays a key role in all movement dysfunction that follows developmental disability, age and disease. At present the department is equipped with all new modalities. This department runs an OPD where 200 patients are treated by the therapists in OPD and wards which include treatment of intensive care patients in cardiac, recovery, cardiac surgery, pediatric and neonatology, MACU and trauma wards and burn ward in Kasturba Hospital.

		MARCH 1961 (M/s Mafatlal Gagalbhai and Bros. donated a sum of Rs. 1,25,000/- to the Mumbai (then Bombay) Municipal Corporation, thanks to the untiring efforts of Dr.L.H.Hiranandani, the then Professor and Head of the E.N.T. Dept. for the establishment of the Gagalbhai Audiology Clinic at B.Y.L.Nair Charitable Hospital. However, the clinic could be started only in January 1963 due to nonavailability of qualified professionals in India.		
		JANUARY 1963 A U.K. trained Speech Therapist Ms.Saker Mistry (nee Cooper) was appointed in the ENT Department under the able leadership and guidance of Dr.L.H.Hiranandani.		
		MARCH 1964 Another generous donation of pound sterling 3000 was received from M/s Kishanchand Chellaram Trust, U.K. again thanks to Dr.L.H.Hiranandani.		
		<b>JANURARY 1966</b> The inauguration of a fully equipped Audiology Clinic.		
		JUNE 1966 A two year Diploma Course in Audiology and Speech Therapy was started, the first of its kind in India, with an intake capacity of 10 students. The		

planning and execution of the training programme was carried out by Mr. R.K Oza, a U.S. trained Speech Pathologist and Audiologist, who was also first Superintendent from Oct. 1966 to April 1968 and then Professor and Head of the Department from May 1968 up to March 1975.

JUNE 1967 Continuous support given by the Mumbai Municipal Corporation enabled the starting of a two-year Bachelor's programme in Audiology and Speech Therapy-B.Sc.(A.S.T.) affiliated to Bombay (now Mumbai University) - the first Degree programme in this profession in India. From June 1977, it became a three year degree course and the nomenclature of the programme was changed to Audiology and Speech Rehabilitation (ASR) with effect from the academic year commencing from June, 1991.

With the establishment of the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, the affiliation of the Bachelor's degree programme was transferred to that University from the academic year commencing from June 1998 with the nomenclature Bachelor of Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology (B. ASLP) starting with the First Year of the

course to be progressively extended to the other years.

**AUGUST 1967** Another munificent donation of H.K.Dollar 53,000/-was received from friends and well-wishers of Dr.L.H.Hiranandani from Hong Kong.

Thus Dr. L.H.Hiranandani verily has been the proverbial friend, philosopher and guide of the Department and has been the driving force in its inception and development.

**OCTOBER 1973** Muhurat Ceremony for classes for the hearing impaired at the Agripada Municipal School premises.

**DECEMBER 1973** Formal inauguration of the same, by His Excellency (Late) Shri Ali Yavar Jung, the then Governor of Maharashtra).

**JULY 1974** Setting-up of the Training Programme for Audiologists and Speech Therapists for teaching hearing-impaired children was started in 1974.

Since then there has been no looking back and the Silver Jubilee of the Department was celebrated on a grand scale in 1987-1988.

SEPT. 1994 Our dream of starting the P.G. Course which was facing one hurdle or other since early 25 years was finally realized during the tenure of the Dean Dr. (Smt.) K.D. Nihalani when the University permitted to enrol not more than 6 students to M.Sc. (Audiology and Speech Rehabilation) Course. The intake capacity has been increased to 8 w.e.f. the academic year 1977-98. The affiliation to the Master's programme is also being transferred to MUHS from the academic year 1999-2000 with change in nomenclature to MASLP. Present intake capacity for MASLP is 10 students
