INTRODUCTION

The Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai is an autonomous body established under the provision of Mumbai Municipal Corporation Act-1888 to administer the civic affairs of the Mumbai City.

Before the three and half century, Mumbai was a group of seven small islands and main residents were the Koli people. Their main occupation was fishing and agriculture and plantation of coconut. In the year 1667, these islands were taken on rental basis by East India Co. for the purpose of trade and business and Mumbai was being developed and now known as capital of the state.

Initially, the border of the Corporation was limited up to city area. In the year 1950, suburban area, known as L, M, N, H, K Ward and in the year 1957, extended suburban area known as S, T, P and R Ward were merged in the Corporation.

The city has been divided to administrative ward for the purpose of local administration. With the passage of time larger ward were subsequently sub divided and today there are 24 administrative wards. Out of that 'T' Ward is situated the north eastern part of the suburban. It measures about 45.42 Sq. Kms. in area and as per sense of 2001, population of 'T' Ward is 330168.

SPECIALITY:-

The entire area of 'T' Ward is bifurcate in 2 parts by Central Railway line and known as Mulund (East) and Mulund (West). Mulund (East) is having a educational complex by name Kelkar College with all necessary facilities. The larger part of Mulund is a residential part. Town planning scheme has added in proposed development of Mulund. Large pharmaceutical company like Johnson & Johnson is situated in Mulund. State Employees Insurance Scheme Hospital having coroner facility and other charitable Hospital are providing medical facilities to the residents of not only local people but also the citizens residing in Eastern Suburbs. Kalidas Drama Theatre and Sports Complex with swimming pool are the asset of Mulund Residents. The largest water reservoir and water purification plant in Asia is known as Bhandup Complex is situate in this ward, which provides pure water to Mumbai City .

L.B.S. Road is at present is a attraction of Mumbai Citizens give to sky scrapper building and shopping malls.

Mulund is a gate way of Mumbai and there are three octroi collection points. one at Lal Bahadur Shastri Marg, second at Vasantrao Naik Eastern Express Highway and third at near Airoli Bridge connecting Mumbai and Navi Mumbai and high revenue is collected on this points as octroi.
